"Beloved, building yourselves up in your most holy faith, praying in the Holy Spirit, keep yourselves in the love of God, waiting for the mercy of the Lord Jesus Christ that leads to eternal life!" -Jude 20-21

Gospel Devotion/Meditation- Jude 20-21: What a privilege to be addressed as the "beloved" of God Almighty! Though we are



sinful, He is compassionate and merciful, and demonstrates holy wisdom in being just and the justifier of all who believe in Jesus Christ, His Beloved Son (Rom. 3:23-26; Rom. 5:6-8). Our God loves us, and addresses us as He addresses His own dear Son, as His "Beloved". Meditate upon this prayerfully for a moment. In our union with Jesus Christ by His Spirit, our Heavenly Father sees us wrapped in Christ's perfect righteousness, and He loves us just as he loves His Son; 'tis true (John 17:20-26)! Whatever else may define us, let "Beloved" be central to how we think of ourselves as those loved by the Father in Christ, through the love of the Holy Spirit. In this address, and in this perfect right standing before Almighty God as those loved by God, let us then build ourselves up in our most holy faith. That is, let us constantly remember ourselves ("preach to ourselves"- ML-J) who God is and what He has done for us in Christ! This summarizes it: "God demonstrates His love for us in that while we were yet sinners, Christ died for us"; and, "God, who didn't spare His own Son but freely gave Him up for us all, how will He not with Him graciously give us all things?!" (Rom. 5:8; 8:32). Let us keep ourselves in this love, by praying

and meditating upon the depth, breadth, height, and width of God's love for us in Christ that we may be filled with all the fullness of God (Eph. 3:17-19). Let us know that Christ is praying for us but has also filled us with His Holy Spirit to uphold us, to strengthen us, to motivate us, to lead and guide us to pray "in the Spirit" in union with Jesus. Let us wait upon the mercy of the Lord Jesus to be fully revealed when He returns! We are recipients now of much of God's mercy in Christ, but we await our full adoption and full revealing as the *Beloved* of God in Christ (Rom. 8:23-31; 1 Cor. 2:9-10; Revelation 21:1-7). Until the day when our eternal life is fully realized, let us cry out with confidence: "*Come, Lord Jesus*"! As we live out this passage of scripture from Jude's Gospel, let this further motivate us to sacrificial, faithful, diligent, joyful service to our king, as we enjoy being and becoming increasingly His *Beloved in Jesus Christ*.
