


## PRAYER NEWSLETTER OF THE REGIONAL HOME MISSIONARY (PMA): MAY-JUNE 2024

### A Gospel Devotion: "I Will Be With You" (Exodus 3)

Our gracious God appears to Moses in a burning bush. He reveals Himself as the self-existent, eternal, unchangeable God of the covenant: "*I am the God of your father, the God of Abraham...*" (Exodus 3:6, 15-16). He assures Moses that he is His ambassador-servant called and sent by Him to Pharaoh in Egypt, the manifestation of the dragon-serpent-lord, so that His beloved, firstborn son (Exodus 4:22), would be redeemed from slavery and made a holy, worshiping people.

Moses responds to our faithful God with "Who am I [to accomplish this redemption that you have called me to]?" Or as we might say, "Who, me?!" And our faithful God responds assuringly and patiently with "I will be with you"

(Exodus 3:12-13). We are inadequate, yet our God is adequate; we are weak, but He is strong (2 Cor. 12:9-10). Our God delights to make His great power and presence known through us. Though Moses responds (like us!) with the "Who, me?!" Our Lord Jesus said to His Father in the power of the Spirit, before the foundation of the world: *"Here am I, send me."* And in the fullness of the times, He came as the Son over the house, the one greater than Moses (Gal. 4:4-7; Heb. 3:1-6). And He was faithful in His life, death, resurrection, and ascension to redeem His people from slavery and make them a people who worship in Spirit and truth!



Jesus tells His disciples on the night He is betrayed that He will not be with them in His ongoing bodily presence, but will be with them truly, really, yet spiritually by His Holy Spirit. He will not leave them as orphans, He will come to them by His Holy Spirit (John 14-16; cf. 14:18). He promises them that "greater things they will accomplish" (John 14:12-14) in church planting and evangelism than He has enjoyed because He has accomplished redemption and is going to the Father to mediate the Holy Spirit to His people in His fullness. He is to become the beloved life-giving Spirit for His people (1 Cor. 15:44-45)! Yet Jesus's disciples respond like us: "Who, me?" "Who, us?! We are to go? How?" And He lovingly and patiently responds with "I will be with you". And in our going, Jesus has promised that His people will be fruitful: "You did not choose me, but I chose you and appointed you to go and bear fruit that will last and whatever you ask the Father in my name, He will do for you" (John 15:16). These are the sweet truths of the Upper Room Discourse of Jesus.

Jesus lovingly and patiently assures His disciples that He has sent them, not to Pharaoh in Egypt, who was a mere manifestation of the dragon-serpent-lord, but to storm the gates of hell itself (Matt. 16:18; cf. Luke 10:18-20). Jesus empowers them by His Spirit, to be confident in His call and love. Christ sends His church to the ends of the earth to redeem His people from slavery to sin so that they become holy worshippers (John 4:23-24). This is what the end goal and joy of church planting and evangelism is: Worship of the Triune God in Christ, seeing God's people redeemed from slavery to sin, fear of death, hard service to the tyrannical dragon-serpent-lord, and being made into a holy temple where God by His Spirit dwells for His glory and the good of His church and world (Eph. 2:1-22).

They do go in the power and the fullness of the Spirit as we see recorded in the Book of Acts. The Word of Grace increases, especially in times of opposition, trials, and persecution (6:7, 9:31, 12:24)! And although we have the powerful example of Christ's promise of His Spirit, we too, alas, initially respond much like Moses and the disciples: "Who, us?!" And Christ says to His people, *"I will be with you to the end of the age!"* "Go, making disciples, baptizing, teaching, and being assured of my presence, power and love for you!" (Matt. 28:18-20). Beloved of Jesus, we are the called and sent ones, too (John 17:18; 20:21-22)! Let us go in the assurance that our God is with us, and that He will grant us a blessed harvest of souls that is beyond anything we could ask or imagine! (Eph. 3:20-21).

Do you believe this? How specifically is our faithful, covenant God calling you to support and to participate in church planting and evangelism? We are the called and sent ones. We are those called to spiritual warfare in the power of the Spirit, storming the gates of hell, to the ends of the earth, and being sanctified as we overcome temptations to comfort and fear. We are called to be faithful in making the gospel known in the power of Christ's Spirit with gentleness and respect (1 Pet. 3:15). Our gracious and faithful God calls and sends us as His "Ambassador-Servants" in Christ to implore sinners to be reconciled to God; God is making His holy appeal through us: *"Be reconciled to God in Christ"* (cf. 2 Cor. 5:18-21).
