



Our Lord Jesus has brought great joy to us as we have enjoyed service and fellowship together this summer at the Berryville Bible Study! This July, we celebrated our one-year anniversary of the bible study's launch! In April,

Pastor Ben Franks, a friend, brother, and member of the Home Missions Committee of the Presbytery of the Mid Atlantic, and I met together for discussion and prayer about our exploratory bible study in Berryville. "Pastor Charles Biggs, our presbytery's Regional Home Missionary, and I are profoundly


grateful for your steadfast support and intercession. Together, we're eagerly discerning the Lord's unfolding plan, trusting that He who began this good work will carry it to completion (Phil. 1:6). In July, [the Sterling OPC] entrusted me with the opportunity to serve alongside Pastor Biggs at the study, sharpening my skills in pastoral ministry while exercising the gifts God has given to me and my family. In light of this, Pastor Biggs established a Sunday Worship



type of liturgy to mirror that context and encourage growth. We began studying the letter to the Philippians in July and plan to finish it by the end of the summer. We open each study with prayer, sing hymns, go over the Westminster Shorter Catechism, and then dive into Philippians, finishing with corporate prayer and a benediction.

The study has been lively, and the discussion illuminates

the text in fresh ways that build up the body together. We are also integrating many of the principles that tends to promote joyful fellowship that is foundational for the Church's culture such as sharing meals together when we gather. Everyone brings food, which helps build the relationships that are essential for a healthy church. We often fire up the charcoal grill as well and cook hotdogs for everyone to enjoy! We are halfway through Philippians, and so far, it has been a joyful blessing. The Lord seems to be uplifting the saints there, and





We have four families participating in the study, along with a few Ruling Elders and a deacon from Ketoctin OPC. All of whom have many kids. The Chet Hobert Park in Berryville as our setting couldn't be more ideal—wide open spaces where kids can roam freely, infusing our gatherings with youthful vitality. As we worship, curious onlookers stroll by, pausing to catch glimpses of our songs and prayers. Just last week, our voices rose in vigorous praise and fervent intercession. Who knows? In time, these

passersbyers might be drawn in to savor the true Bread of Heaven through the gospel's sweet proclamation.

On the outreach front, we're stepping out boldly. I've been crafting short, engaging videos for the Bible Study's Facebook page, strategically targeting folks in Berryville. The response has been promising—several messages of interest have trickled in, sparking conversations that could soon lead to new faces among us. We're also regularly inviting folks who we meet at the park, and gearing up for an exciting evangelism push on August 14th at the local fair, where we'll have a booth to distribute gospel tracts and edifying books, inviting all to encounter the hope we hold dear.
